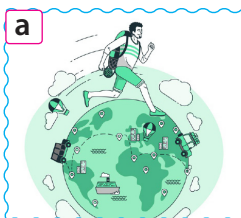

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I'm going to visit. You are going to study. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I'm not going to visit. You aren't going to study. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Am I going to visit? Are you going to study?
<p>USE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> for future plans or intentions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I'm going to watch a movie tonight. We have a meeting. We are going to go home late today. I'm going to study hard and pass the exam. for predictions based on what we see: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The clouds are dark. It's going to rain. Look at how fast that boy is going on his motorbike. He's going to have an accident!

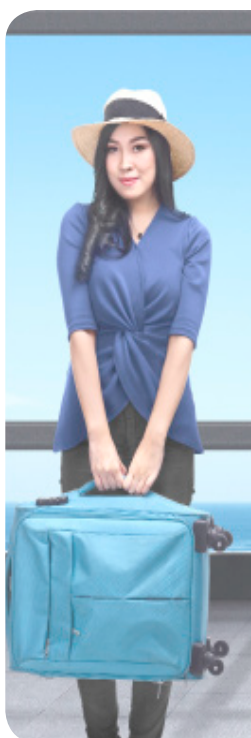
