THE WORLD'S FIRST TEMPLE: GÖBEKLİTEPE

Göbeklitepe is located near Şanlıurfa, Türkiye. It is known as the "zero point in time" because it dates back to 10,000 BC. This makes it the oldest religious site in the world, built long before the Pyramids.

When it was constructed, people were simple hunter-gatherers living in small groups. However, they managed to build huge temples with T-shaped pillars. Some of these pillars weigh 20 tonnes. It is amazing that these heavy stones were carried uphill by people without using any machines.

Today, Göbeklitepe is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It was added to the list in 2018 and attracts tourists from all over the world.

THE ETERNAL RESTING PLACE: ANITKABIR

Anıtkabir is the mausoleum of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the founder of the Turkish Republic. It is located in the Anıttepe district of Ankara and is one of the most important monuments in Türkiye.

The construction of Anıtkabir was completed in 1953. It was designed by two famous Turkish architects: Professor Emin Onat and Associate Professor Orhan Arda. The building is very special because it reflects the characteristics of both Seljuk and Ottoman architecture.

Visitors usually enter the site through the Road of Lions (Aslanlı Yol). This road is 262 meters long and is lined with 24 marble lion statues which represent power and peace. The ceremonial area is surrounded by 10 different towers, such as the Independence Tower and the Peace Tower.

Before Anıtkabir was built, Atatürk's body was kept in the Ethnography Museum in Ankara for 15 years. Today, Anıtkabir is a symbol of the Turkish nation's respect for their great leader.
