Cybercrimes are illegal actions done using the Internet. They can harm people, companies, and governments. Common types of cybercrimes:

Hacking: This happens when someone gets into a computer or phone system without permission to change or steal data.

Identity Theft: This is when someone takes another person's private information, like their name or ID number, and uses it illegally.

Phishing: This occurs when fake emails or messages are sent to people. These messages look real and try to trick people into giving personal details or clicking on dangerous links.

Cyberbullying: This means hurting or threatening someone through the Internet or phone, often on social media. It can seriously affect the victim's feelings and mental health.

Never share your password or personal information online. Always check if websites and emails are real before clicking on anything!

In **CodeQuest**, players start by choosing a mission based on their skill level, such as beginner, explorer, or master. After selecting a mission, players enter the coding chamber, where they must solve logic puzzles using simple commands. As the puzzles are solved, players earn power coins that can be used to buy hints or unlock shortcuts. To increase their final score, players may also collect hidden gems throughout the game. Once all the puzzles in a mission are completed, players receive a special code badge and can move on to a harder mission.
