Grammar Focus

Describing People: Appearance vs. Personality

We use specific questions and verbs to distinguish between how someone looks (physical) and who they are inside (character).

A. Asking about Personality (Verb “to be”)

Question: What is she/he like? / What kind of person is she/he?

Answer: Subject + am / is / are + [Adjective].

- He is a brave person. ■ She's very honest. ■ They are generous.

**B. Asking about Physical Appearance (Verb “look”)**

Question: What does he / she look like?

Answer: Subject + look / looks + [Adjective].

- He looks handsome. ■ She looks very nice. ■ You look tired today.

Grammar Focus

Using "Too" & "Enough"

We use these words to describe degrees or amounts of an adjective.

A. Too (More than necessary)

Rule: It has a negative meaning. We place it before the adjective.

Structure: Too + [Adjective]

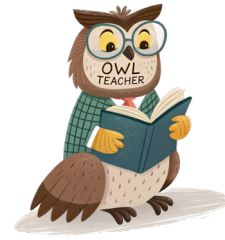
- He is too young to drive. ■ The question is too difficult.

B. Enough (The right amount)

Rule: It has a positive meaning. We place it after the adjective.

Structure: [Adjective] + enough

- She is tall enough to play basketball. ■ He is strong enough to lift the box.

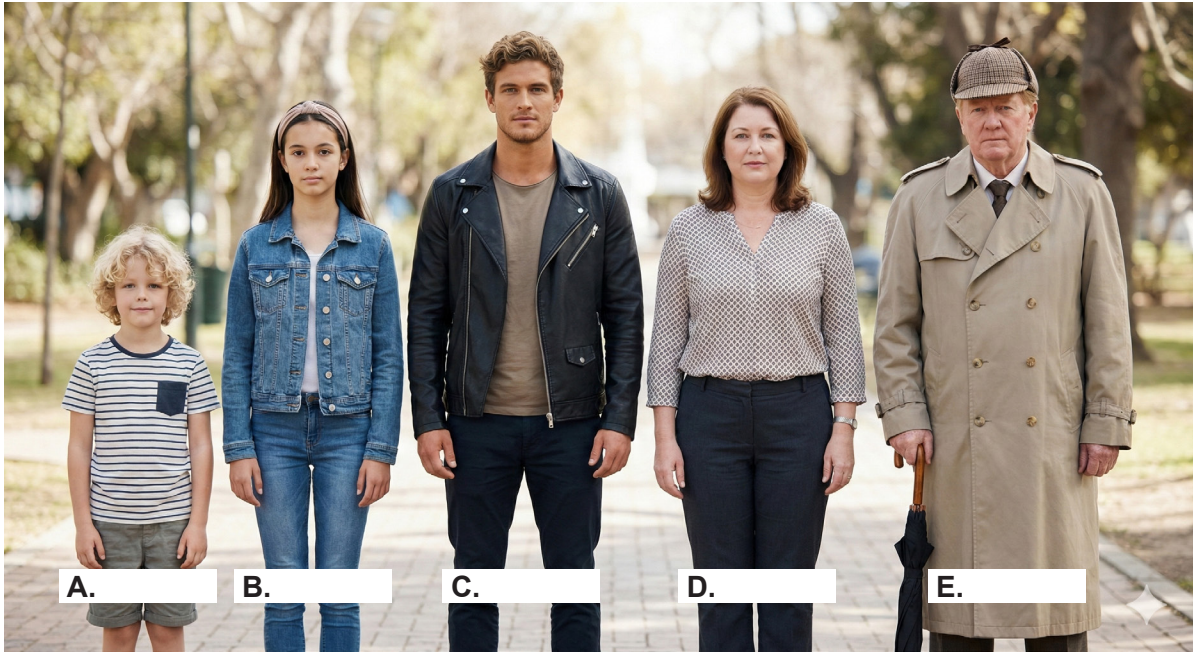
