**Simple Present Tense****(Family Members' Jobs, Work Routines, Activities & Workplaces)**


We use the Simple Present Tense to talk about jobs, work routines, daily work activities, and workplaces.

**I / You / We / They + verb**

- I work as a photographer.
- They design buildings.

**He / She / It + verb + -s / -es**

- She works as a journalist.
- He manages a business.

**Examples:**

- My uncle is a bank clerk. He serves customers at a bank.
- My aunt is a pharmacist. She works in a pharmacy.
- My cousin is a computer programmer. He develops software in an IT company.
- My sister is a content creator. She publishes content online.

**Simple Present Tense (Negative Form)**

**We / You / They + don't + verb** → They don't work in an office.

**He / She / It + doesn't + verb** → She doesn't work at a clinic.

**Wh-Questions with "What / When / Where / How often...?"**

What / When / Where / How often + do + I / you / we / they + verb ...?

What / When / Where / How often + does + he / she / it + verb ...?

**Examples:**

- What is her job?      ■ What does she do?      ■ What do you do?
- What are your parents' jobs?      ■ What do they do?

## Grammar Focus

**Prepositions of Place: at, in, on (Workplaces)**

We use prepositions of place to say where people work.

■ **in** → **Inside a building or enclosed space**

People work in an office, a hospital, a factory, or a restaurant.

■ **at** → **Specific institutions, companies, or general locations**

People work at a law firm, a university, the airport, or a desk.

Note: We often use 'at' for company names (at Microsoft).

■ **on** → **Surfaces, floors, open spaces, and digital platforms**


People work on a farm, a construction site, or a ship.

People work on the second floor.

People work on a social media platform.

■ **from** → **for remote work**

People work from home (remote working).
